Debs went on a journey to find happiness... and found something else. Travelling to the remote Scottish Island of Eigg and Cape Cod, Provincetown, she began an experiment to discover the secrets of 'How to be Happy'. Debs found herself feeling more disconnected as she lost herself in these wild landscapes. Documenting her experiences on film and sound, Debs tells us what she found; procrastination, Body Weather and being photographed by Andy Warhol's Studio 54 photographer. In this comedic and uplifting sequel to her critically acclaimed solo show Hi, Anxiety Debs shares the highs and lows of discovering happiness from a place within.

DEBS GATENBY

Debs Gatenby is a comedian, writer, performer and actress.

Over last 20 years, Debs performed for Queer Up North, Festival No. 6, Glasgay, Manchester Laughing Cows Comedy Festival and was the first performer on stage at Duckie – Royal Vauxhall Tavern. Debs performed with Christopher Green as part of his Working Men's Club show at Latitude Festival.

In 2013, Debs wrote and developed a solo show that was funded by the Arts Council and supported by Contact Theatre Manchester, Slunglow in Leeds and The Albany in London. The show successfully toured the UK in 2014, including as part of Anxiety UK festival in London and Homotopia in Liverpool. It had three sold out nights at the Contact Theatre.

Hi Anxiety: "All three performances in Manchester sold out, and the audience feedback was over-whelming positive. Demand for the show was such that we could have programmed another few nights had we the space." Queer Contact Producer.

Debs also shares her work at conferences and colleges and is currently developing work for radio. She is also touring her work internationally in New York and the Afterglow Festival in Provincetown Cape Cod MA.

PUBLICITY CAMPAIGNS

Debs refers to Ambient Celebration at the end of the show as she ended her year of searching for Happiness in charge of this hilarious department at Marks & Spencer, working as a Christmas Temp.
